

New Britain Museum of Art, New Britain, CT nbmaa.org
Free regular price admission for 4 people (No special programs/exhibits)
Founded in 1903, it is the first museum established in the U.S. dedicated solely to American art. The museum is dedicated to serving all people by pursuing excellence in art through collections, exhibitions, and education. Special exhibits, movies and lectures.

Old State House, Hartford, CT ctosh.org
Free admission for 2 adults and 2 children (Not valid for special or after hour events)
The Old State House was the site of the Amistad Trials and sits on the site of the first witch hanging in America (55 years before Salem.)

Old Sturbridge Village, Sturbridge, MA osv.org
50% discount off daytime admission for up to 4 individuals per visit.
Old Sturbridge Village, the largest outdoor history museum in the Northeast, depicts a rural New England town of the 1830s. **NOTE: Pass no longer available after 9/26/16**


Peabody Museum of Natural History, New Haven, CT peabody.yale.edu
\$5.00 off each admission for up to 4 people (Closed on Mondays, not valid in Feb.)
The Museum houses 4 billion years of earth history under its roof. See prehistoric mammals, birds and dinosaurs, rare minerals, meteorites, and Egyptian artifacts.

Stamford Museum & Nature Center, Stamford, CT stamfordmuseum.org
Free admission for 1 family, 2 adults and children of the house. (On special Festival Days, the passholder and individuals will be charged \$5 per person.)
Visit the animals at Heckscher Farm, the observatory and planetarium, an Otter Pond. Explore the Overbrook Nature Center and Nature's Playground, or bring a picnic and enjoy the lakeside picnic area.


Stepping Stones Museum for Children, Norwalk, CT steppingstonesmuseum.org
One free admission with every paid admission. A maximum of 3 free admissions.
Children of all ages are encouraged to explore, invent, test, and observe. The Museum encompasses five galleries and over 100 hands-on activities. Exhibits include Energy Lab, Tot Town, Build It! and a multimedia theater.

Wadsworth Atheneum, Hartford, CT thewadsworth.org
Free admission for 2 adults and 2 children (17 & under) or buy one, get one free film admission. Fees apply for special programs.
The Wadsworth is the oldest continually operating public art museum in the United States, founded in 1842. It is home to nearly 50,000 works of art that span 5,000 years. Exhibits include paintings, costumes and textiles, the Wallace Nutting collection of American colonial furniture, and African American art and artifacts.

Check out a pass today! Passes are available to Danbury Library adult cardholders at the Junior Services desk on the 2nd floor. One pass per family may be checked out for 3 days. Aldrich Contemporary Art Museum, Ridgefield, CT aldrichart.org

Free admission: 1 adult pass holder and 4 family members (galleries only)

Founded by Larry Aldrich in 1964, the Aldrich is dedicated to fostering innovative artists whose ideas and interpretations of the world around us serve as a platform to encourage creative thinking. The Aldrich is the only museum in Connecticut devoted to contemporary art.

American Museum of Natural History, New York, NY amnh.org

Free general admission to museum & one special exhibition film, or live animal show

The Museum is one of the world's preeminent scientific and cultural institutions. It is renowned for its exhibitions and scientific collections, which serve as a field guide to the entire planet and present a panorama of the world's cultures.

Beardsley Zoo, Bridgeport, CT beardsleyzoo.org

\$5 admission per person for up to 6 people. Limit 1 family per day.

See more than 300 animals representing primarily North and South American species. Learn about endangered and threatened species, see the South American rainforest with free-flight aviary, and walk through the "pop-up" prairie dog exhibit.

One free touring admission with each paid admission (limit 4 per day)

Hands-on exhibits challenge kids to think creatively and solve problems. They can observe lizards in mock habitats, build Lego cars and put them to the test on a racetrack, follow a history of Mars, and learn about the Earth's rotation under a Foucault pendulum.
